COMPREHENSIVE PLAN AMENDMENTS

The City of College Place will be accepting applications for Comprehensive Plan Amendments for 2013. Applications may include land use map and text amendments. All applicants are required to show cause as to why their proposed change should be made. Plan Amendment Applications may be obtained from the City of College Place Community Development Department, 625 S. College Ave., College Place, WA 99324, from 8 a.m. until 5 p.m. Monday through Thursday and 8 a.m. until 4 p.m. on Fridays. WATER CONSERVATION TIPS FOR NOVEMBER

1. Know where your master water shut-off valve is located. This could save water and prevent damage to your home.
2. Winterize outdoor spigots when temperatures dip below freezing to prevent pipes from leaking or bursting.
3. When you give your pet fresh water, don't throw the old water down the drain. Use it to water your trees or shrubs.
4. When you are washing your hands, don't let the water run while you lather.
5. Look for products bearing the EPA Water Sense Label for items that have been certified to save 20% or more without sacrificing performance.

LEAF PICK UP

To have your leaves picked up by the City, they must be free of branches, brush, trimmings, and placed **loose (NO BAGS)** on the street. The City will not pick up leaf piles that contain other yard debris. There are no designated pick-up days. Crews will pick them up as they are able and will continue to pick up leaves throughout the fall. Should you have any questions regarding leaf pick-up, please call the Public Works Department at 525-0510.

Leaf pick up will begin in earnest after the first major freeze. As you begin to rake your leaves to the curb, it would be helpful if the leaf piles were placed six (6) inches away

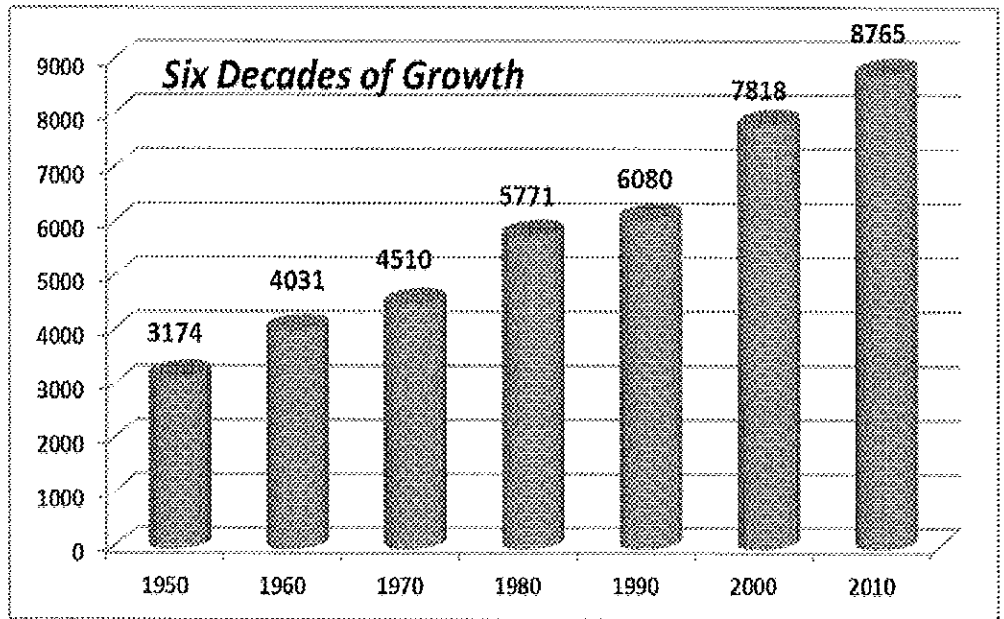


from the curb. This helps to minimize any potential flooding and clogging of drains when it rains. Putting your refuse container six (6) inches away from the curb will help as well.

POPULATION HISTORY FOR THE CITY OF COLLEGE PLACE

On the 27th day of November, 1945 there was a ballot measure before the citizens on whether to incorporate as the Town of College Place. The majority of the 337 votes cast were in favor of the ballot. The Walla Walla County Board of Commissioners approved the incorporation of the town on December 24, 1945. Then in June of 1979, the city changed its classification from a town to a non-charter code city.

Since these beginnings, we have seen substantial growth in the population of our community. As the chart shows below, since 1950 to 2010 the city has grown from 3,174 to 8,765 in population; and increase of 176%. The growth rate has been up and down throughout this sixty year period. Growth has varied from highs of 28% to lows of 5% during these ten year intervals. The Washington State Department of Financial Management has estimated the 2012 population at 8,845.
