How to Apply for a Building Permit

Applying for a building permit does not have to be difficult. Our applications are designed to be informative, quick and easy complete. Keep in mind the more complicated the project, the more information required to provide City staff with enough information to confirm your project will be built within current code requirements.

Accessory Building Setbacks

Hey home improvement junkies! If your next project is building that garden shed in the backyard, remember that detached projects that are less than 120 square feet do not require a building permit but they still need to meet setbacks. College Place Municipal Code 17.42.030 allows for a detached accessory building to be located up to five feet of a rear and side property line, provided that the total square footage of the building is no greater than 600 square feet and no closer than ten feet from buildings on an adjacent lot.

Water Conservation tips for August

1. Adjust your lawn mower to a higher setting. A taller lawn shades roots and holds soil moisture better than if it is closely clipped.
2. Use sprinklers for large areas of grass. Water small patches by hand to avoid waste.
3. Use sprinklers that deliver big drops of water close to the ground. Smaller water drops and mist often evaporate before they hit the ground.
4. Avoid recreational water toys that require a constant flow of water.
5. Wash your car on the lawn and you'll water your lawn at the same time.
