Licensing Dogs in College Place

Year 2013 is almost upon us and it is time for our pet owners to renew their pet's licenses for next year. This can be done at the College Place Police Department located at 625 South College Avenue. For more regulations regarding pets in the community, Municipal Code Chapter 6.04 can be accessed on the College Place website at www.ci.college-place.wa.us. To avoid a late fee licenses must be obtained by March 1 every year.

The yearly fees are listed below:

College Place issues its own dog licenses for all city residents. Do not confuse the dog licenses issued by the Blue Mountain Humane Society to the city of Walla Walla & County residents. Prior to the issuance of a dog license, the dog must be inoculated for rabies. The city does not license other types of animals, including cats.

Another thing to note is that any dog which is acquired by a resident after January 1 of each year must be licensed within 60 days of its acquisition. A late fee of \$10.00 is charged to the owners of those dogs that are picked up after the 60 day time frame is expired. Planning Commissioner Opening

The City of College Place is accepting applications for a volunteer position on the Planning Commission. Planning Commission is a recommending body to the City Council and hears land use requests such as zoning, proposed plats and comprehensive plan amendments.

Applicants should be a resident of College Place and able to attend evening meetings. Currently the Planning Commission meets the third Tuesday of each month with occasional workshops and additional meetings as needed.
