On June 2, 2014, the College Place City Council unanimously voted to appoint Julie Scott to fill the Mayor vacancy that occurred due to the passing of Rick Newby. A full-time resident of College Place since 1994, Mayor Scott's involvement in local politics began in the summer of 2013 when she was appointed to the College Place City Council. She was elected to a four-year term on the council in November, 2013.

Mayor Scott and her husband have lived in College Place, WA for most of their married life. Scott was born in the old Walla Walla General Hospital, and lived with her parents in College Place until she moved as a four-year-old to Southern California where she grew up. She returned to Walla Walla College as a history major and met and eventually married, Kraig Scott, a music major from Aldergrove, British Columbia, who is a member of the music faculty at Walla Walla University. They have two sons, Alexander, a former member of the College Place City Council, now a student at Gonzaga University School of Law, and Andrew, a May 2014 graduate of the United States Military Academy in West Point, NY. She has been involved in many community volunteer organizations and boards during her years living in the valley; including Walla Walla General Hospital, Walla Walla Valley Academy, United Way, and the Walla Walla Symphony.

Scott has been an organizational development consultant since 2002. She works with a broad variety of companies in many industries including manufacturing, financial services, education, healthcare, and high technology, most headquartered in the Northwest, but some further afield in North America. Scott is an independent associate with Korn/Ferry International based in Minneapolis, MN, and is certified in Korn/Ferry's Leadership Architect Suite of tools; she is also a certified MBTI® feedback provider and coach. She has assisted dozens of companies with certifications, strategic planning, 360 assessments and facilitated feedback, executive coaching, and identifying and developing high potential employees.

The first 15 years of her career were spent in higher education, first as a development director and the last nine years as an award-winning professor of business at Walla Walla University. Scott holds an MS in journalism from University of Oregon, an MBA from University of Rochester's Simon School of Business, where she was awarded the prestigious Bruner Scholarship; and a PhD in Leadership, with cognates in business and public policy, from the University of Washington.
